Proper Worship Conduct– Start Early (part 1)

Babies are crying, children are playing, books are being read, hand-held video games are going strong, and food crumbs are scattered on the floor. No, this is not a get-together. These are things I often see and hear when my family gathers with the saints to worship God.

I completely understand the desire to occupy children so we can fully worship God for the entire service; but although that is important, it is also critical that we train our children to serve and obey Christ above everything else.

Parental Behavior

The most effective way we can teach our children is by setting a proper example. If we are passing notes, doodling, fidgeting, constantly looking at our watch, or whispering to the people around us, we give our children a clear and direct message that we think other things are more important than worshipping God.

Before we can even start teaching our children to participate in the service, we need to be participating ourselves. Let's put the paper away (unless we are taking-not passing-notes), avoid sitting around people who we are tempted to talk to, and sing every song, even if it is not among our personal favorites.

Location Matters

It is important to consider our children when choosing where to sit during worship. For example, if our family sits close to one of our daughter's friends or someone who is playing with toys she is much more interested in watching what they are doing than sitting still and worshipping God. My husband and I also do not let her sit with other people during service because training her is a job for us as her parents. (Proverbs 22:6).

An older child might be able to sit with a friend, but be selective. If a friend is allowed to have video games, that is going to send your child mixed messages. The better idea is to have the friend sit with you so you can monitor their behavior.
