THE MICROPHONE IS ON

Several years ago, I remember the wife of a preacher friend recounting how her husband, after the delivering the invitation, hurriedly made his way to the restroom. After a few moments she realized, along with everyone else in the room, he had forgotten to turn off the microphone. Luckily she raced to his rescue and the rescue of everyone else in the room.

Many humorous incidents have occurred through the years where someone forgot a microphone was still on. There have also been some not so humorous incidents. Some instances have occurred where something unkind was said and unintentionally broadcast via a live microphone. I have witnessed many such incidents throughout my life. One instance I remember was when the Public Address system intercepted an apparent argument between a husband and wife, right in the middle of worship services. Another instance involved media, of another kind. An email chastising someone, intended to be sent to a few people, was instead accidentally sent to an entire address book, including the person of whom the writer was chastising.

Sins of the tongue are frequently mentioned throughout the Bible. They come in the form of gossip, false oaths, and rumors, lies, swearing, and taking the Lord's Name in vain. This is a list of just a few things that have caused problems throughout all of history. As James said, "No man can tame the tongue. It is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison" (James 3:8)

We should ask this question before we speak, "If what I am about to say has a possibility of being broadcast to the church, my family, my close friends, my place of employment, school and any social clubs I am apart of, would it still be worth it to say it?" Would we be more prone to find the good, rather than the evil, less likely to be judgmental, more likely to encourage and less prone to criticize another, when we speak, if others were listening? What would we say if we knew everyone was listening? Would we heed the words of our Lord, "But I say to you that for every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the Day of Judgment. For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned (Matthew 12:36, 37). Even though others may never hear our words, or read our emails, the microphone is always on with God. He knows every "Intent of the thoughts of our hearts" (Genesis 6:5).

"Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one" (Colossians 4:6).
